The Galiano Conservancy Association (GCA) seeks a highly motivated individual for the position of *Land Stewardship Technician*. This 4-month full-time seasonal contract position offers engaging work and an opportunity to gain career skills in the beautiful setting of Galiano Island from May through August.

Land Stewardship Technician

Start date: May 6, 2024 (negotiable)

Wage: \$21.58 / hour (\$20.75/hr + 4% Vacation Pay)

Hours: 35 hours / week (on average), typically Mon-Fri, 9am-4pm

Anticipated End Date: August 30, 2024 (negotiable)

Duration: 17 weeks, with up to 1 week off (560 hours over 4-month period)

Application Deadline: 11:59pm PST on January 31, 2024

Job Details:

As the Land Stewardship Technician, you will work both in the field and in the office, both independently and directly with the Conservation Coordinator, Restoration Team and other experienced Galiano Conservancy staff on a variety of projects related to land stewardship and the Mid-Island Protected Areas Network. Primarily, you will be responsible for trail improvements & maintenance, as well as assisting with habitat monitoring and ecological restoration projects. This position involves an average of five days of work each week, based out of the Millard Learning Centre (10825 Porlier Pass Road) on Galiano Island.

Tasks and responsibilities may include:

- Species at Risk monitoring and inventory programs
- Assisting with conservation covenant monitoring
- Invasive species removal
- Designing and coordinating the production and installation of interpretive trail signage
- Promoting trails and public MLC amenities through social media, print, and email
- Improving the GCA website through content creation and copywriting
- Assisting with the GCA's ecological restoration and permaculture activities
- Working as part of a team with restoration ecologists and environmental interpreters
- Identifying native and exotic species, including species at risk
- Participating as a resource person for environmental education programs
- Group facilitation with children, youth and adults
- Light conservation infrastructure construction, maintenance, and / or decommissioning
- Writing articles for publication in our local community magazine and for our social media outlets
- Research and review of restoration, forestry, ecology and other related literature
- Propagation of native plants in a nursery
- Public outreach regarding environmental protection and stewardship, and native plant sales

Skills and experience gained may include:

- Field data collection
- Understanding the effects of recreational activities on ecosystems
- Understanding of the effects of agriculture and forestry on ecosystems
- Experience organizing and facilitating groups and public events
- Trail design and construction
- Working in remote and rugged field conditions
- Using a Global Positioning System (GPS) for mapping, navigation and data collection
- Using GIS (ArcGIS Pro) for mapping and data analysis
- Using remote monitoring trail cameras and recording devices for species at risk research
- Working as part of a team
- Conducting research and literature review
- Working in remote and rugged field conditions
- Graphic design using Adobe Suite and/or Canva
- Communications skills including oral presentations and writing for print and online (social media)

Requirements:

This position will require physical, social, and intellectual work. The candidate must demonstrate a capacity for leadership, the ability to work effectively both as part of a team and independently, and a willingness to learn and engage themselves in hard work. Applicants must be prepared to live on Galiano for May through August, spend long hours outside doing physical labour, and be available for occasional work on weekends. The applicant must have current Standard First Aid, or be willing to obtain it before

coming to Galiano. This position is partially wage subsidy funded, and to meet the funding criteria, applicants must be between the ages of 15 and 30 and be either Canadian citizens, permanent residents, or a person with refugee status eligible to work in Canada. Because the Galiano Conservancy conducts activities at a variety of locations throughout Galiano Island, a class-5 driver's license is required and access to a reliable personal vehicle/transportation is strongly preferred.

Assets:

BIPOC applicants and applicants with a connection to Galiano Island will be given preference; please identify yourself in your cover letter if applicable. A background in Environmental Studies, Biology, Geography, Restoration of Natural Systems, Conservation, Forestry, Environmental Education or another complimentary field is desirable. Direct experience in any of the skills mentioned for this position is an asset, particularly project management, graphic design, and/or construction. Experience with ecological restoration, permaculture, and/or plant propagation are also strong assets.
