



The Galiano Conservancy Association seeks a highly-motivated individual for the position of **Sustainable Food Systems Technician**. This 4-month full-time seasonal contract position offers engaging work and an opportunity to gain career skills in the beautiful setting of Galiano Island from May through August.

Sustainable Food Systems Technician

- Start date:** May 6, 2024 (negotiable)
- Wage:** \$21.58 / hour (\$20.75/hr + 4% Vacation Pay)
- Hours:** 35 hours / week (*on average*), typically Mon-Fri, 9am-4pm
- Anticipated End Date:** August 30, 2024 (negotiable)
- Duration:** 17 weeks, with up to 1 week off (*560 hours over 4-month period*)
- Application Deadline:** 11:59pm PST on **January 31, 2024**

Job Details:

As the Sustainable Food Systems Technician, you will work independently and in a team on a variety of projects related to sustainable food production and plant propagation. Primarily, you will be responsible for assisting the Sustainable Food Systems Coordinator to operate an active plant nursery and forest garden (food forest), and their associated social enterprises. This position involves an average of five days of work each week, including some evenings and weekends, based out of the Millard Learning Centre (10825 Porlier Pass Road) on Galiano Island.



Tasks and responsibilities may include:

- Propagation and care for native and edible plants
- Soil building and soil care
- Caring for the forest garden and operation of a mechanical/computerized watering system
- Garden harvesting
- Harvesting, processing and blending herbs for tea
- Maintenance and operation of demonstration-scale compost systems
- Identification of native species and forest garden plants
- Removal of invasive plants from protected areas
- Native/edible plant and forest garden (including added value) sales at Saturday market
- Conducting tours for visiting groups
- Assisting with restoration activities and monitoring resulting ecological responses
- Recording Food Forest and Nursery data in spreadsheets
- Assisting with trail building, Species at Risk monitoring and education programs

Skills and experience gained may include:

- Propagation of native plants and forest garden species
- Operation of a mechanical computerized watering system
- Composting systems and applications
- Identifying native and introduced species, including species at risk
- Understanding of the effects of forestry and recreational activities on ecosystems
- Working as part of a team with restoration ecologists and environmental interpreters
- Group facilitation with children, youth and adults
- Public relations at local public events
- Communications including writing for print and online (including social media)
- Conducting research and literature review
- Working in remote and rugged field conditions

Requirements:

This position will require physical, social, and intellectual work. The candidate must demonstrate a capacity for leadership, the ability to work effectively both as part of a team and independently, and a willingness to learn and engage themselves in hard work. Applicants must be prepared to live on Galiano for May through August, spend long hours outside doing physical labour, and be available periodically for work on weekends. The applicant must have current Standard First Aid, or be willing to obtain it before coming to Galiano. This position is partially wage subsidy funded, and to meet the funding criteria, **applicants must be between the ages of 15 and 30 and be either Canadian citizens, permanent residents, or a person with refugee status eligible to work in Canada.** A criminal record check may be required, and will be arranged before arrival. Because the Galiano Conservancy conducts activities at a



variety of locations throughout Galiano Island, a class-5 driver's license is required and access to a reliable personal vehicle/transportation is strongly preferred.

Assets:

BIPOC applicants and applicants with a connection to Galiano Island will be given preference; please identify yourself in your cover letter if applicable. A background in Environmental Studies, Agriculture, Biology, Geography, Restoration of Natural Systems, Conservation, Environmental Education or another complementary field is desirable. Direct experience in any of the skills mentioned for this position is an asset, as is a demonstrated knowledge of the various uses of native plants and cultivated species and an understanding of how to market and sell related products.
