## COMMUNITY FORESTRY COORDINATOR

This hybrid role involves fieldwork, community engagement, and operational support, with a focus on collaboration with the Kitasoo Xai'xais Stewardship Authority.

## QUALIFICATIONS

- **Education:** Diploma in Forest Technology or related field; FIT designation (or eligibility) under the ABCFP required.
- **Experience:** 2–3 years in forestry operations, project coordination, or community engagement. Knowledge of Cultural Forest Inventory, Indigenous communities and stewardship principles is an asset.
- **Skills:** Excellent communication, organizational, and project management skills. Strong understanding of sustainable forestry practices and cultural stewardship.

## WORKING CONDITIONS

- **Hybrid:** Combines field, community, and office-based work, with remote flexibility as needed.
- **Travel:** Regular travel within Kitasoo Xai'xais territories is required.

## RESPONSIBILITIES

- **Community Engagement:** Liaise between the forestry company and community, fostering transparency and inclusivity. Organize workshops, promote employment opportunities, and integrate traditional ecological knowledge.
- **Field Operations:** Conduct surveys, Cultural Forest Inventory, and stewardship tasks like habitat monitoring and restoration. Ensure environmental, cultural, and safety standards.
- **Project Support:** Coordinate forestry projects aligned with community values. Collaborate with contractors and stakeholders to ensure smooth execution.
- **Stakeholder Collaboration:** Build relationships with the Stewardship Authority, ecological consultants, and regulatory agencies.
