Position Overview

• Seeking individuals for several field crews to collect data for UBC graduate studies on wildfire history, wildland fuels and ecological fire effects in collaboration Community Forests + First Nations

Required Qualifications

- Interests and coursework in forestry, natural resource management, or conservation
- Detail-oriented and ability to work independently and as part of a team
- For field work, you must be physically fit and able to work long days outside, hike in steep terrain carrying a heavy backpack regardless of the weather and insects
- Full commitment to field research safety protocols
- Adherence to respectful and ethical research protocols with First Nation and local communities

Desired Qualifications

- Previous field work experience please describe your past responsibilities and contributions
- Previous backcountry experience please describe any backcountry trips and/or jobs that have required travel or work in harsh and/or remote environments and climates
- Driver's license and clean driving record
- High academic achievement and motivation to develop plant identification skills

Job Details

- Collecting field data on effects of wildfires and fuels mitigation on forests and plants
- 4 months full-time from May August 2025, based in interior BC (south + north)
- Rate of pay: \$3000/month + housing provided in the field (includes some camping)
- Training will be provided but you must supply your own hiking equipment (boots, pack, etc.)
